



Written Statement of Behaviour principles

The Education and Inspectors Act 2006 and DfE guidance (Behaviour in Schools, 2012) requires the Governors to make and frequently review, a written statement of general behaviour principles to guide the Head teacher in determining measures to promote good behaviour.

This is a statement of principles, not practice.

The school is committed to providing an environment where all people can feel safe, happy, accepted and integrated. It is important that an orderly framework should exist within which effective teaching and learning can take place.

Our emphasis will be on recognising and celebrating positive learning attitudes and success, so that all students feel valued.

We will teach students to take responsibility for their own actions and to accept the consequences of their choices. We will adopt a zero tolerance approach to bullying and any such incidents will be dealt with promptly and firmly.

The school holds an important position in the wider community, educating the young citizens of tomorrow in a way that will ensure that they take a positive and proactive role within their community in the future.

General Conduct

As a Banovallum student I am expected to be:

- Polite and well-mannered to all;
- Good-humoured and disciplined;
- Appropriately-dress in uniform;
- Quiet and purposeful in moving around safely;
- Honest, fair and considerate towards others;
- Respectful of the environment, equipment and all facilities in school;
- Respectful to all in the school community and our neighbours by not using foul or inappropriate language on the school site or in the immediate vicinity of the school;
- Respectful of the school building by not chewing gum on the school site;
